Notice of the Passing of a Resolution that the Basic Rate of Local Property Tax remains unchanged in the Administrative Area of Cork City Council

The Finance (Local Property Tax) Act, 2012 (as amended), makes specific provision that elected members of a local authority may pass a formal resolution to vary the basic rate of the Local Property Tax for their administrative area by a percentage known as the local adjustment factor. I hereby give notice that, at a meeting of Cork City Council on 28th September 2017, a formal resolution was passed to the effect that the basic rate of Local Property Tax should remain unchanged for 2018, in respect of relevant residential properties situated in the administrative area of Cork City Council.
