PROPOSED HOLDING OF TWO EVENTS
BY CORK CITY COUNCIL**

This notice has been prepared pursuant to the provisions of the Part XVI of the Planning and Development Act, 2000, and gives details of the events as described hereunder, ('the event'), which is proposed to be held. The proposed events will be carried out by Cork City Council.

1. Switch on of the Christmas Lights

The proposed event will comprise of a music performance and celebrity to switch on the Christmas Lights. This family event will take place on Sunday, 19th November from 6.00pm to 7.30pm, on St. Patrick's Street, between Academy Street and Drawbridge Street. We are creating an event for 10,000 people.

2. GLOW

The proposed event will take place at Bishop Lucey Park and Grand Parade on: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 8th, 9th, 10th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 20th, 21st and 22nd December, 2017.

The festival will comprise of a family-focused spectacle in Bishop Lucey Park, funfair elements and food market on Grand Parade. It is anticipated that the festival will attract audiences of up to 130,000 over the 12 days of the event.

The proposal, including a draft plan for the management of both events, may be inspected during office hours at Cork City Council's Main Reception Desk, New Civic Offices, City Hall, Cork, from today Thursday, 19th October 2017 until 10am Thursday, 9th November 2017.

Submissions or observations with respect to the proposed event may be made **in writing** to the Director of Services, Corporate and External Affairs, Cork City Council, City Hall, Cork, before 10am Thursday, 9th November 2017.

A report in relation to the proposed event will, in due course, be prepared and submitted to the Members of Cork City Council for consideration in accordance with the requirements of Section 238(3) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000.
